

Lady Tigers' season ends in 8-0 loss to Catholic-Pointe Coupee

NEW ROADS, La. - The seventh-ranked St. Mary's Lady Tigers softball team was shutout, 8-0, by the second-ranked Catholic-Pointe Coupee Lady Hornets Friday in the quarterfinals of the Division IV select softball playoffs.

The Lady Hornets (20-14) scored three runs in the first inning as they loaded the bases then scored on a single, RBI groundout and passed ball.

The Lady Tigers (16-12) put runners at second and third and nobody out in the third inning. Junior GK Philen drew a leadoff walk then Mallory LaCaze reached on a throwing error. After back-to-back strikeouts, Kennedy Griffin walked to load the bases with two outs for Tyonnah Burton.

Burton ripped the first pitch of the at bat to the right field wall clearing the bases. However, after Catholic-Pointe Coupee appealed, it was ruled that Burton missed first base which resulted in the final out of the inning and no runs scoring.

The score remained 3-0 going to the bottom of the fifth when CPC hit a three-run homer with two outs to give the Lady Hornets a 6-0 lead. CPC added two more runs in the sixth to make it 8-0 as the Lady Tigers' season came to an end.

The Lady Hornets finished the game with eight nine hits while SMH had just two knocks.
