## Lady Tigers' roll into quarterfinals with 9-2 win over Central Private

NATCHITOCHES, La. - The seventh-ranked St. Mary's Lady Tigers' softball team pounded out 12 hits as they cruised to a 9-2 win over the 10<sup>th</sup>-ranked Central Private Lady Redhawks Tuesday in the second round of the Division IV select playoffs at SMH.

The Lady Tigers (16-11) took the early lead as AG Mabile led off the bottom of the first with a single then later scored on a wild pitch.

The Lady Redhawks (17-3) threatened in the third inning as they loaded the bases with the middle of the order due up and only one out. However, SMH starting pitcher Grace Wren got a popout and groundout to end the inning with no damage.

St. Mary's led 1-0 going into the fourth inning when the offense exploded. Freshman Joelee Savell ripped a lead-off double off the center field wall. Moments later, Brooklyn Townson lined a single to left putting runners at the corners and nobody out. Mallorie LaCaze hit a sacrifice fly to left to score Savell making it 2-0 but SMH was just getting started.

After a walk to GK Philen, sophomore Addy Price then lined a two run-double to the right center gap to score Philen and Townson making it 4-0. Wren helped her own cause later in the inning with an RBI groundout to score Price. Then, Kennedy Griffin singled to left to plate Mabile pushing it to 6-0.

The Lady Tigers added two more runs in the fifth as Philen grounded a single through the left side to score LaCaze. Price then singled to left to plate Philen as SMH took an 8-0 lead and never were threatened as they picked up the win.

Mabile, Griffin, Savell, LaCaze and Price all had two hits to lead the 12-hit Lady Tigers' attack. Price drove in three runs as well.

Wren threw a complete game allowing just two hits, two earned runs, four walks and struck out six.

The Lady Tigers advance to the quarterfinals where they will face the winner of second-ranked Catholic-Pointe Coupee (18-14) and 15<sup>th</sup>-ranked Central Catholic (12-13) who play Wednesday at 5 p.m.
