St. Mary's vs. Logansport recap

LOGANSPORT, La. - Sophomore pitcher Trey Scarborough threw a no-hitter as the St. Mary's Tigers' baseball team cruised past the Logansport Tigers, 10-0, on the road in district 3-1A action.

St. Mary's (17-11, 7-0 in 3-1A) wasted no time getting the bats going as they scored four runs in the first inning. Payne Williams hit an RBI double to score Ayden Warren followed by an RBI single by Connor Jordan. Moments later, Scarborough hit a sacrifice fly scoring Williams followed by an RBI single by Preston Martinez to make it 4-0 SMH.

Logansport (12-12, 4-3 in 3-1A) struggled to get anything going offensively as Scarbough was dialed in early, only allowing three walks in the first four innings.

St. Mary's continued to pull away as they added two more runs in the fourth. Nathan Slaughter reached on an error and scored later in the inning on a throwing error. A.J. Lavespere scored on a wild pitch later in the inning to make it 6-0.

SMH added another run in the fifth as Scarborough was hit by a pitch and later scored on a sacrifice fly by Slaughter to make it 7-0.

After St. Mary's scored three runs in the top of the sixth to take a 10-0 lead, the only drama left was Scarborough's no-hit bid. He got the first two hitters of the inning to groundout and a strikeout. After an error prolonged the inning, Scarborough got the next hitter to lineout to Ryan LaCaze in right field to complete the no-hitter.

"Trey came out and did what he was supposed to," said SMH baseball head coach Marty Dewees. "He located his fastball and pitched backwards affectively and earned a heck an accomplishment tonight."

Scarborough allowed three walks, struck out seven and threw 91 pitches.

"I just tried to find the strike zone and let them hit and it kept working," said Scarborough. "I realized in the fourth inning that I hadn't allowed a hit but then I figured I wasn't going to get it because of baseball superstitions. But this is an accomplishment off the bucket list, and I can say i did it once."

Williams and Jordan led the way for SMH's 10-hit offensive attack as both collected three knocks.
