

Williams clutches up with Chiefs down to their final out, NCHS wins 6-4

The top-ranked Natchitoches Central Chiefs' baseball team was down to their final out before Titus Williams hit a two-run single with two outs in the top of the seventh as the Chiefs rallied for a 6-4 win over the Buckeye Panthers Thursday night on the road.

The Chiefs (10-0) trailed 4-3 entering the seventh inning. Yancy Spillman and Kyron Payne led off with back-to-back singles followed by a sacrifice bunt by Owen Smith. After a strikeout, Brock Laird was intentionally walk loading the bases with two outs for Williams. He lined the first pitch he saw to center field scoring Payne and Spillman. Laird was able to come around and scoring on a throwing error as the Chiefs took a 6-4.

NCHS retired the side in order as Harper Marcotte recorded the save as he retired the side in order in the bottom of the seventh.

The Chiefs finished with just five hits but drew six walks allowing the NCHS offense to muster enough offense to pick up a thrilling come-from-behind win.
