

The St. Mary's Lady Tigers softball team opened the season in style Tuesday afternoon beating Glenbrook 12-0 on the road.

The Lady Tigers (1-0) got 11 hits from the offense led by freshman Malorie LaCaze. The SMH shortstop finished 3-for-4 with 4 RBIs. First baseman Tyonnah Burton was 2-for-4 with a 3-run homer while Jenna Sklar was 2-for-2 with 2 runs scored. Freshman Kennedy Griffin was 1-for-2 with two runs scored and two RBIs.

In the circle, it was the dominance of Grace Wren that set the tone for SMH. The sophomore allowed just one hit while striking out 12 in six innings.

The Lady Tigers also showed patience at the plate drawing seven walks for the game while striking out just three times.

"We played good all around," said SMH softball head coach Stephen Wren. "I thought we hit the ball and the pitching and defense were terrific. We got contributions from multiple players and then of course the big hit from Tyonnah, that ball hasn't landed yet," Wren joked.
