

Tigers edged by Buckeye 2-1 at home

The St. Mary's Tigers' baseball team lost a tough one, 2-1, Wednesday night at home to the Buckeye Panthers.

SMH (13-9) dropped their third straight game despite a terrific pitching performance from Trey Scarborough. The sophomore pitched six innings and didn't allow a run while scattering three hits and striking out seven.
