

The St. Mary's Tigers' baseball split two games Saturday beating Doyline 13-3 and falling to Red River, 9-1, during the final day of the Many Tournament.

In game one, the Tigers (2-2) broke a 3-3 tie in the third inning against Doyline by scoring six runs as they batted around in the third.
