The top-ranked Lakeview Gators advanced to the quarterfinals of the Division IV non-select basketball playoffs with a 78-72 win over the Ferriday Trojans Tuesday at home in the second round.

The Gators (25-6) had to fight as the Trojans (16-14) battled every step of the way for 32 minutes. Lakeview seemed to be in control in the first half as they led 25-12 after the first quarter and 38-26 at halftime.
